




Welcome to the Lindbergh School District Summer 2015 Enrichment Program

Location of program and Drop off/Pickup Information

The program will be located at **Sperreng Middle School, 12111 Tesson Ferry Road.**

When dropping off your child, you have two choices:

1. park your car and walk your child inside

For this choice, please park in the front parking lot of Sperreng Middle School. You will then enter through the front doors on the left side front of the building. Proceed down to the back section of the building for classes.

2. remain in your car and drop off your child

For this choice, please use the side parking lot located on the Concord School Road side of the building. You may pull close to the doors, and adults will supervise your child's walk inside the building.

When picking up your child, you have two choices:

1. park your car and come inside to get your child

For this choice, please park in the front parking lot of Sperreng Middle School. Enter through the front doors on the left side front of the building. You will meet your student in the front commons.

2. remain in your car and adults will help your child to his/her car

For this choice, please use the side parking lot located on the Concord School Road side of the building. Adults will be supervising students on the sidewalk area as they wait for parents to pull up.

*******PLEASE NOTE:** We have two different locations for student pick up. This will help our students stay safe and alleviate traffic congestion. Before your child leaves you each morning, please tell him/her to report to the front commons (adults walking in to get their child) **or** the side parking lot (adults remaining in cars) at dismissal time. Thank you!!!

Please help your child stay safe by explaining our procedures to grandparents, babysitters, and anyone else who will be transporting your child.

Students Walking Home

Students that will be walking home from the program need to bring a note from a parent or legal guardian stating that their student is allowed to do so. The School District does not provide crossing guards at any streets surrounding the building.

Tuition

This is a fee-based program. Fees vary according to the class. Fee information is listed with each class. Classes are based on a first come first serve basis. **PLEASE MAKE THOSE SUMMER PLANS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AND REGISTER!**

General Information

The program will be located at **Sperreng Middle School, 12111 Tesson Ferry Road.** Information can be obtained by calling the Activities Office at 314-729-2400, extension 4908. A direct number will be given to students on the first day for the Sperreng Summer Enrichment Office. The schedule has been planned to provide flexibility for our students. The Summer Enrichment program for 2015 will offer THREE one week sessions. Enrollment numbers will determine course availability. **It is imperative that pages 38-41 be completed in full.**

Schedule

The THREE one week sessions allow for flexibility for Lindbergh families. Family vacations will now become easier to schedule, and fewer obstacles will be in the way of a fun and exciting summer experience. Each session will be offered from 8:30 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. Each session will offer a wide variety of classes appropriate for all grade levels. Parents may choose from one to three different classes each session. If a student takes part in all three sessions, they can participate in nine different classes throughout the program. Some classes may be taken more than one time.

Eligibility for Students

Classes are for students who have **completed kindergarten** through eighth grade. The grade level and ages to which each class is offered is indicated in the brochure.

Special Needs

If your child requires specific accommodations in order to access this program, **please** include this information on your application as it will ensure your child's needs are met. It is imperative that parents contact us if they have children with **any** type of special needs; medications/prescriptions (EPI pens, etc.) mental or physical differences, learning disabilities, etc., that would impede their safety or learning process in this educational setting. Notification/registration deadline is May 8, 2015.

Program Guidelines

Students are expected to respect one another and have FUN! Disruptive students who deny others the opportunity for enjoyment will be referred to the program director and may be removed from the program. **Students must be picked up promptly after class. Due to the nature of this program, we cannot provide child care in-between classes.**

Class Time

The program runs June 8, 2015 through June 25, 2015. The hours of operation are 8:30 a.m. - 12:15 p.m., Monday thru **Thursday**. There will be THREE SESSIONS offered this year. Session A, June 8 - 11, Session B, June 15 - June 18, Session C, June 22 - 25. Classes meet according to the dates and times shown throughout the brochure.

Attendance

Parents are requested to call the Summer Enrichment office extension when their student will **not** be in attendance. Students arriving late for class are asked to stop in the enrichment office. Information will be given to students on the first day as to which number to call in the event of an absence.

Registration

Registration can be accomplished by completing the following: Enrollment, Internet permission forms, Media release, and Hold Harmless forms located in the back of this brochure. A check should be made payable to Lindbergh Schools. Your cancelled check is your receipt. We reserve the right to cancel a class at any time. Registration deadline is May 8, 2015.
