Understanding Courses

Core Challenge Exploratory Elective Intervention/Specialty

Core Classes

Mandatory courses in which all students must participate to meet state standards:

- English Language Arts (ELA)
- Mathematics
- Science
- Social Studies
- Health and Fitness



Challenge Classes

Core courses offering advanced learners* an opportunity to explore greater depths of content knowledge and critical thinking skills:

- English Language Arts
- Mathematics
- Science
- Social Studies

*Challenge criteria = Teachers make recommendations based on academic grade reports, MAP scores, eValuate scores, and student interest and motivation. Form will be shared the week of 2/6-10.



Exploratory Classes

Semester-long, alternating day courses offering opportunities to discover and explore specialized interests, aptitudes, and abilities in the fine and practical arts:

- Art
- Digital Literacy
- Drama
- General Music
- Design & Modeling (7th) & Automation & Robotics (8th)
- Family and Consumer Sciences
- Keyboarding



Elective Classes

Year-long, daily or alternating day student selected courses offer opportunities to pursue special activities and interests

- Modern Languages: French, German, Spanish
 - 7th grade year long **alternating day**
 - 8th grade year long **every day** (upon successful completion student receives one unit of credit towards high school graduation requirements)
- Band
- Choir
- Orchestra



Specialized Classes

- <u>Intervention Classes</u> course offerings designed to provide supplemental small group instruction for students who may have gaps in understanding of essential reading or mathematical skills - <u>math lab, reading strategies, academic lab</u>
- <u>IEP/Resource Classes</u> course offerings designed to meet student learning needs as indicated in the Individualized Educational Plan (IEP)
- <u>LEAP</u> course offering designed for gifted students providing enrichment, extension, and curriculum explorations
- <u>High School Credit Courses</u> Algebra, Geometry, Spanish, German, French. All have specific requirements to obtain high school credit.
