

Dressel Elementary School Title I Partnership Policy

At Dressel Elementary School we know that students learn best when everyone works together to support education. Teachers, parents and students themselves are all responsible for ensuring a productive year of learning. This year, Dressel will be a Schoolwide Title I building. This federally funded program allows interventionists and Reading to be available to work with any student at Dressel that has a need. Part of the program requires that all parents are informed about Title I and that families understand with this Partnership Policy.

What you can expect from the Dressel Teachers and Staff:

- Provide a positive environment where students feel safe and supported.
- Create meaningful learning experiences.
- Communicate clearly about academic progress and school events.
- Adjust instruction and provide intervention to meet the needs of students.

Family support is needed in the following areas:

- Make sure your child comes to school on time and ready to learn.
- Reinforce the importance of education.
- Attend school events such as Conferences, Math and Literacy Nights.
- Read and respond to communication from the school regularly.

Students should strive to:

- Be respectful and responsible.
- Give their best effort in class.
- Ask for help when needed.
- Read nightly and complete any homework.
